COVID-19 Notice 07

We have compiled a short list of new **benefits, supports, and resources** that are being offered through Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments during these times. Though this list is not exhaustive, we hope that it will assist families and individuals to be aware of what is being done to support them. Please note: Supports that require an application will be indicated with an *.

- For anyone who has lost their job or their working income, whether they are eligible for Employment Insurance Benefits (EI) or not, the Canada Emergency Response Benefit* will offer a taxable benefit of \$2,000 a month for up to four (4) months. Eligibility has been expanded. To find out if you are eligible or to apply go to <https://www.canada.ca/en/revenue-agency/services/benefits/apply-for-cerb-with-cra.html#apply>
- The one week waiting period for EI Sick Benefit has been waved
- The Canada Child Tax Benefit has been increased by up to \$300/child effective May 2020 for 2019-20
- The Government of Canada will provide up to \$3 billion in federal support to increase the wages of low-income essential workers (Province will decide how to distribute)
- The Special Goods and Services Tax Credit will provide a one-time special payment in early May
- Income Tax Filing due date has been deferred to June 1, 2020
- While schools are closed, parents with children up to 12 years of age can apply for a one-time payment * of \$200 per child and \$250 for those with special needs. For more information go to <https://www.ontario.ca/page/get-support-families>
- The required minimum withdrawals from Registered Retirement Income Funds (RRIFs) has been reduced by 25% for 2020 to support Seniors
- Electricity prices for residential customers will be kept at the lowest rate, known as the off-peak price, 24 hours a day for 45 days

- The Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) * has expanded eligibility and is ensuring that electricity and natural gas services are not disconnected for nonpayment during the COVID-19 outbreak. - Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) loan and interest accrual relief for students. No payments will be withdrawn for six months and no interest will accrue over this time.
- The Ontario Government announced that it will double the Guaranteed Annual Income System (GAINS) payment for low-income seniors to \$166 per month for individuals and \$332/month for couples for six months starting Apr.2020.
- The federal government announced that seniors who qualify for Old Age Security (OAS) will be eligible for a one-time, tax-free payment of \$300, and those eligible for the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) will get an extra \$200.
